I did want to provide some background about the WisTech program and how the state plan reflects the work that WisTech is striving to achieve. WisTech provides training opportunities and technical assistance to the WisTech program subcontractors to carry out the required activities of the AT Act of 1998, as amended in 2004. In Wisconsin, the primary subcontractors to the AT program are the eight Independent Living Centers (ILCs) of Wisconsin. Activities that the ILCs will carry out as part of the AT Act include device loans, device exchanges, device reutilization, device demonstrations, and state financing. This allows individuals with disabilities, their families, and other representatives to learn about AT from specialists that work with AT on a daily basis.
